

TWO TAX PAYMENTS

Change in Law Concerning Collection.

MAY BE A SURPRISE TO SOME

Object of the Law Is That Tax Levied in Any Year Shall Become Collectible During the Same Period.

ALBANY, Or., April 19.—(Special.)—"Will property-owners in Oregon have to pay double the usual amount of taxes in the Fall of 1936?" is a question that is discussed at some length by Linn County citizens nowadays.

It will be recalled that at the last session of the Legislature House bill No. 167, entitled "An act to provide more efficient means for the assessment and collection of taxes," etc., was passed, and later received the Governor's signature, thus becoming a law.

Now, then, the contention is that in the Fall of the year 1934, when the new system of collecting taxes is installed, taxpayers will be burdened with a double payment of taxes.

It is generally agreed that the new method, when once established, will be much more satisfactory than the old. But it is also agreed that the doubling-up year will be a hard one for taxpayers.

DISPUTE OVER ENCAMPMENT.

Commander Bedell Will Go to Spokane and Seattle.

WALLA WALLA, Wash., April 19.—E. C. Bedell, commander, and E. W. Elliot, Assistant Adjutant-General, of the Department of Washington and Alaska, O. "I have come to the conclusion that this matter cannot be adjusted by correspondence," said Commander Bedell, "and I propose to make a Spokane committee show its hand. There is a discrepancy somewhere, and I am going to ferret it out."

BODY IS FOUND IN RIVER

MYSTERIOUS DEATH OF SOUTHERN PACIFIC PASSENGER.

Acted Queerly and Left Train at Dunsuir—Suspicion That Man Has Been Murdered.

DUNSMUIR, Cal., April 19.—(Special.)—At 5 P. M. today the body of a man was found in the Sacramento River here, at a point just back of the Southern Pacific repair shops. Deputy Coroner L. E. Wells was notified and had the body taken from the river. It proved to be that of a man of about 40 years of age, average height and weight, apparently a workman, fairly well dressed, and the only articles of personal effects found on his person was a gold watch, silk fob and Masonic keystone with the name of M. Nebrecht engraved upon it.

Mr. Wells began an investigation and learned from Conductor Bristow and brakeman Chattam and Hebl that the man was a passenger into Dunsuir on today's southbound passenger, No. 11, having been on same when it came into Ashland, Or., where this crew took charge. He acted queerly and at or near Susan had a fit and afterward acted as if he might attempt to try and leave the train, so the conductor ordered him to remain in his seat.
