CHURCH FIGHT AT CRISIS

FIRST BAPTIST TROUBLES SOON TO BE SETTLED.

Question of Acceptability of Rev. Alexander Blackburn May Be Discussed Tonight.

It is expected a crisis will be reached in the First Baptist Church within a few days. A business meeting of the church may be called to discuss the question of the pastor's acceptability to the membership, or the entire matter will be dismissed.

Neither faction will acknowledge that the situation is serious or that it affects the church's well-being in any manner. But it is conceded that something will be done toward a settlement at once.

While it is not probable, it is possible some action may be taken tonight. This is the date of the church's regular worship service, and after its conclusion a discussion of the question is not out of the list of possibilities.

So far as the other faction will acknowledge, nothing has been done, as yet, toward calling a general meeting of the congregation for a discussion of the friction over the pastor. But that such action is likely to be taken immediately is acknowledged.

Rev. Alexander Blackburn is not working over the outcome of the contest, nor do his friends show any signs of doubt as to his ability to win. He is anxious to have the matter come to a head and be settled without unnecessary delay, fearing the effect of discontent by continued discussion upon the prosperity of the church.

It is declared by friends of the pastor that he will not take any action that would affect the standing of his church or threaten the disruption of the congregation. If he is convinced that he stands in the way of a united church he would surrender the pastorate. But at present both Mr. Blackburn and his friends believe the fact that has been said to change represents but a small minority. Until it is conclusively shown that this is not true the pastor and his friends will continue to hold this view.

It is pointed out that the opponents of Mr. Blackburn have not, thus far, urged anything that could be interpreted as a reflection upon his personal character. This, it is asserted, is one of the impossibilities and it is because of this that his reputation is unassailable that it is believed by his friends that the trouble will soon blow over.

The question of securing a new church is not one that worries the minister. He has filled pulpits in many of the larger cities of the country before he came to Portland, four and one-half years ago, and there is no question but that he would be promptly invited to another church were he to leave Portland. But Mr. Blackburn and his friends naturally desire to win, since a fight has been started, and they are determined upon to make a good showing of strength whenever the issue is forced.
