Fifteen More Recovered From the Ruins—Child Identified Its Mother—The Whole Krug Family Perished.

FEW CHILDREN ESCAPE.

Flood Wipes Out New Generation—Judge Keithly's Graphic Story.

HEPPNER, Or., June 18.—(Staff correspondence.)—The paucity of children at Heppner is an evidence of the awful havoc of the flood.

There have been many rumors of bodies having returned to life when picked up one or two days after the catastrophe.

A Mrs. Hagar was borne away from the morgue yesterday with a bleeding leg. The story got abroad that she had returned to life while being prepared for burial.

Judge Julius Keithly, 70 years old, tells one of the most remarkable tales of escape of any.

"I'm alive today," he says, "because I kept my head. No, I'm not bruised very much.

The Judge lost his wife and grandchild in the flood. A man named Harris, a tinner, who lived at his house, was also carried away.

"We were preparing supper," says the Judge, "when a heavy storm began. I was uneasy and so was Harris. Frequently I went to the door and looked out.
