Oregon City Mill Buildings Destroyed.

Volunteers' Good Work

Three Hundred People Are Out of Employment.

Insurance Covers the Loss

Portland Department Ready to Respond to Call for Aid—Third Destructive Blaze in the Same Property Since 1870.

Spontaneous combustion is said to be the cause of the fire that destroyed the pulley, dyehouse, machine shop, picker-house and boiler-house of the woolen mill of the Oregon City Manufacturing Company.

Oregon City, Or., July 14.—(Special.)

Fire tonight destroyed property of the Oregon City Manufacturing Company valued at between \$75,000 and \$100,000. The loss is covered by insurance.

The flames were discovered issuing from the roof of the wool-house at 9 o'clock this evening, but the building was already doomed, and the adjoining frame structures were soon ablaze.

A general fire alarm was responded to by the Fire Department and citizens, who fought heroically. The main woolen mill building was on fire several times, but under the direction of Fire Chief Ruonich the structure was saved.

Vigorous and timely action alone saved the property of the Portland Flouring Mills Company. The large warehouse of this company was aflame a number of times, but by brave work the building and adjoining mill were saved.

The woolen mill people are heavy losers by the fire. The wool-room contained about 200,000 pounds of wool, in addition to a large quantity of manufactured yarns and other woolsens.

The fire chief complained of the Portland Fire Department, who were communicated with and had fire-fighting apparatus aboard a car preparatory to coming to Oregon City in case the services were required.

With a stiff breeze from the northeast, it is considered remarkable that the Portland Flouring Mills were not burned. The firemen did effective work, and in appreciation of their valuable services several citizens gave the men a midnight lunch.

In 1873 the Oregon City woolen mill were entirely destroyed by fire, and in 1887 a blaze originating in the pulley destroyed practically the same buildings that were wiped out tonight at practically the same loss to the company.

BASTILLE DAY IN PARIS.
