

ROTTERS ARE SLAIN

Russian Troops Shoot Down Workmen.

STRIKERS WRECK THE TRAIN

Conflict Between the Military and Men on Strike on the Trans-Caucasian Railway, near Tiflis, Causes Many Deaths.

ST. PETERSBURG, via Frontier, Aug. 2.—There are reports that there were fresh collisions between the troops and strikers on the Trans-Caucasian Railway, near Tiflis, last Thursday. The troops were ordered to fire on the rioters, who were using revolvers, with the result that 21 workmen were killed.

CHINESE ARE SULLEN.

Good Feeling Toward Foreigners Broken by Recent Execution.

PEKING, Aug. 2.—China is witnessing a return to the conditions which followed the coup d'etat of 1901. Political discussion among the Chinese which increased during the imperial court's recent policy of friendliness toward foreigners has suddenly stopped.

OPENING OF ORIENT PORTS.

China and Korea Make Free to Foreign Trade.

TOKIO, July 18, via Victoria B. C., Aug. 2.—The Korean government has now decided to open the port of Wiju to foreign trade. In this connection the Korean publicists and the Japanese Seoul correspondent that in accordance with Russian objections Korea was inclined to abandon the proposal, but the Japanese Minister at Seoul and the Korean government that Japan already considered Wiju to be open.

MISSIONARIES MURDERED.

Chinese Insurgents Cause Other Foreigners to Flee to Hankow.

TOKIO, July 18, via Victoria, B. C., Aug. 2.—News reports from China disclose patches to the A-shah that three Roman Catholic missionaries have been murdered by Chinese insurgents at Pingli, in Shansi Province. The remaining foreign missionaries and their families, escorted by Chinese troops, have arrived at Hanyang, whence they took passage for Hankow.

Passengers Wanted War News.

VICTORIA, B. C., Aug. 2.—Officers of the steamer Tacoma, which arrived today from Yokohama, report that the Russian agents were buying up large orders of heavy-coke at the Japanese ports and storing provisions and war munitions at Fort Arthur. Troops were also being hurried westward and war was expected to occur at any time.

Cable Charges Lowered.

TOKIO, July 18, via Victoria, B. C., Aug. 2.—The Japanese telegraph companies have consented to the lowering of the telegraphic charges on messages between Nagasaki and Hong Kong for the Pacific cable.

Japanese Discover Comet.

TOKIO, July 18, via Victoria, B. C., Aug. 2.—Shiro Inoué, a Japanese astronomer, has discovered a new comet in the Cygnus constellation, not far from the Lyra, moving northward.

USED PEASANTS FOR MARKS.

Prince Urusoff, of Russia, has Gone Insane.

LONDON, Aug. 2.—The Times this morning prints a Vienna dispatch saying that the Emperor of Russia received with benevolence from the Croats in the United States a petition describing the position of Croatia in the darkest terms. It also says that Prince Urusoff, who on July 7 was reported as having been wounded in the Bazar district by peasants, has become insane. The dispatch says he was in the habit of testing his skill as a marksman on the bodies of his peasants.

MOROCCAN PRETENDER DIED.

Bu-Hamara Said to Have Succumbed to His Wounds.

TANGIER, Morocco, Aug. 2.—It is reported that the pretender, Bu-Hamara, has died of his wounds. He has been first rated a number of times since he first raised the standard of revolt in 1902.

Earthquake in Italian Town.

LONDON, Aug. 2.—Dispatches say that an earthquake has destroyed some houses in the towns of Flattiera and Mulazzo, in the Province of Tuscany, Italy. Flattiera is a town of 200 inhabitants and Mulazzo a town of 400.

MIMIC NAVAL WAR ON.

Fleet of the "Enemy" Leaves for Sea to Lose Themselves.

BAR HARBOR, Me., Aug. 2.—The war game will begin tomorrow morning at daylight, when the "enemy," consisting of the battleships Indiana, Texas and Massachusetts and the torpedo boat destroyers Lawrence and Whipple, in command of Admiral J. P. Sande, will sail from here to lose themselves out on the Atlantic.
