# Hungarian Prune Crop.

From the official hornicultural journal of Budapest it is learned that the prune crop of Hungary will not be more than a low average crop. While in some localities good crops are promised, the excessive cultivation has materially leasened the general prospects The reports from Doents and Servia are no more promising. Bosnin-Herzegovnia will have, it is thought, only about one-half the crop of 1902. On the whole, the outlook for prune crop is anything but sncourag-The Bosnia producers and dealers had Ing. each from 10 to 20 carloads of prunes left over from 1802. Owing to the unfavorable prospects there is no bargaining yet for the new crop.
