Freight Rate on Coal From East Cut.

DENVER, Nov. 12.—Representatives of every railroad entering Denver from the East have agreed to make a rate of \$3 a ton for coal from the mines of Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Indian Territory and adjacent fields.

When the price of coal goes high enough to make it profitable to import coal at such a rate, it will go into effect. In the meantime, the independent mines in the Northern Colorado fields are resuming. Nine mines are now working there, with a total of 289 men and a daily output of 87 tons. Negotiations are under way for the resumption of every independent producer in the district by next Monday.
