

PULPIT DECLARED VACANT But Congregation Will Probably Retain Rev. J. H. Gibson.

The action of the presbytery of Oregon, which met at Oakdale, Or., in declaring vacant the pulpit of the Grand-Avenue Presbyterian Church and thus deposing Rev. J. H. Gibson, is seriously resented the majority of members of that Accusations were made against Rev.
