

FINE A STEAMSHIP

Longshoremen Retaliate for Loss of Work.

NOME CITY THE SUFFERER

Vessel Will Be Taxed at San Francisco for Permitting Another Union to Load Her Here—Arrival of the Rajore.

The International Longshoremen's Association will give its "fine" system a practical trial at the steamer Nome City reaches San Francisco.

The charterers of the steamer, the California & Oregon Coast Steamship Company, have tried to give the loading job to members of the Grainhandlers' Union.

When the Nome City arrives at San Francisco she will be discharged by the Longshoremen's Union of that place.

This system is in vogue on the Lakes, but has only once before been practiced here.

The Nome City's cargo will amount to 150 tons of wheat.

It is possible the steamer will not go to San Francisco, but will deliver her cargo at San Pedro.

The Rajore comes to Meyer, Wilson & Co. and brings 150 tons of pig iron, 15,000 fire bricks, 100 tons of fire clay, 250 boxes of clay pipes, 500 barrels of China clay, 250 boxes of cement, 250 tons of coal.

The vessel as yet has no outward engagement.

FRUITMEN WANT CANNERY

RUSSELLVILLE GROWERS SEEK TO EFFECT COMBINE.

Object is to Raise Prices and to Sell Surplus Fruit to Canning Establishments.

In the Russellville district, on the Base Line road, where the fruitgrowers are forming a fruit combine, with the ultimate object of building a cannery, there are about 250 acres in strawberries, blackberries, raspberries, currants and some other fruits.

The fruitgrowers are interested in the movement. They estimate that they produce enough fruit to furnish a cannery, and still have some left for the local market.

The territory embraces a tract about four miles square, and is estimated to comprise 80 per cent of the fruitlands in Multnomah County.

Their present problem is to effect a combine that will maintain prices so that they can make a profit.

Their ultimate object is to get a cannery established both at Montavilla, and to this end they propose to work. It is considered too late to build a cannery this year, as the berry season will soon be here.

It is proposed to lay the ground work now of a fruit cannery to be put up near Russellville, about a mile from the town.
