

GROWING FAST AS EVER GREAT PROGRESS OF EASTERN SUBURBS OF PORTLAND.

New Factories at St. Johns, Sellwood and Montavilla—Need of More School Room on All Sides.

While there is no authentic record, it may be said that Portland suburbs are building up faster so far this year than ever before. Inside the city limits building permits are issued and a record of the dwellings erected can be kept, but not so with the suburbs, which fringe the southern, eastern and northern boundary lines, and cover thousands of acres of land, all of which is really part of the city and should be so credited.

Building on the Peninsula. At St. Johns dwellings are springing up in every direction, and yet there are no houses for rent. One hundred and twenty-seven were counted within half a mile of the electric railway station, and this number does not include all by any means.

On the bluff along the Willamette boulevard some large dwellings are being put up, and the foundation of a large house for the Peninsula Lumber Company has just been laid.

The Acme Lumber Company has completed a large lumber yard on the bluff overlooking the Peninsula Lumber Company's mill, to handle locally the output of this and the Green Bay Lumber Company's plant.

Sellwood Cigar Factory. At Sellwood the building for the Portland Cigar Factory is completed, and the machinery in place, and work will be started this morning.

In the Mount Tabor District. The building at Montavilla to be occupied by the brown factory is nearly completed, and represents an investment of about \$100,000.

The public school building is overcrowded, and the directors will have to provide at least two more rooms for next year. Principals throughout the city are reporting that the school year is a struggle.
