

EACH HEAT A RACE

Opening Trot at State Fair a Warm Contest.

WON BY LONZO, THE FAVORITE

Cavalier Takes the Five-Hundred-Dollar Pacing Race—Running Events Won by Gauchio and St. Philippina.

SALEM, Or., Sept. 12.—(Special.)—A large crowd, a track that was lightning fast, and a day that was made especially for splendid racing marked the opening of the racing here today. The crowd that swelled the betting ring, the horsemen, and even the band, had a decided Portland atmosphere.

As is usual with the opening day's racing at affairs of this sort, there was almost two hours' delay in sending off the first event, a baby race for 2-year-olds. It was the opening stake event of the fair, and five out of the six starters faced Starting Judge H. E. Wood. The race was won by Clever Byron's Lonzo, a hot favorite in the track, and the fact that his entries only Mike Duff was scratched, and out of the five that started four were Zombro colts, and all five of the youngsters were Oregon-bred horses. The fact made the race easily the feature of the day, and instead of it being no contest, as such colts races usually are, each of the three heats was a horse race.

The first heat was won by Princella J., a Bonner N. E. filly, and those who took the field against Lonzo reaped quite a harvest. After considerable scoring, the babies were sent away, and the race was like a riddle race, and Driver Sawyer had a hard time keeping him steady. This heat was trotted in 2:35, but in his work-out Lonzo had shown footing at a much lower mark, and again he ruled favorite. The second heat he won with ease in 2:31½, and after the heat Sawyer was called into the judges' stand for an explanation. He explained that the colt had started without too plates in the first heat, and that was the cause of his unsteadiness. Sawyer came right back in the third and last heat, and after allowing Princella J. to lead part of the way down the back stretch, he sent the son of Zombro along and won the heat pulled up in 2:32.

It took four long-drawn heats to settle the 2:30 pace for a purse of \$500. After breaking badly in the first heat and finishing absolutely last, Cavalier, driven by W. G. Durfee, finished second in the second heat, and then came back and won the race by taking the next two heats. Cavalier and Helene were favorites.

Lance took the lead with Helene at the first bend, and with Maud W. the pair raced so fast that Cavalier and Jack Wilnot were carried off their feet. Childs got Wilnot down, but before the colt could get Cavalier into his stride, he was out of it. Maud W. and Helene booked up together down the back stretch, but at the three-quarters Helene had raced Maud M. daisy, and she fell so far back that the distance flag fell on her. Jack Wilnot beat Cavalier half a length in the next heat. The next two heats were easy for Durfee, but at the finish of the last heat Cavalier was all in.

The fields in both of the running races were made up of horses that had raced at Portland. The first event, while a racing affair, was won by Billy Donaldson's Gauchio. Lady Rice was second and Cannell was third. Past Master was favorite at even money, while Gauchio was ruled at three. At the last moment there was a heavy play on Myrtle H., but like the live wire that was on Master, it was a false alarm. Starting Judge Wood sent Gauchio away to a splendid start. Little Clark sent Gauchio to the front at once, and he won with the red driving hand behind him. Neither Master nor Myrtle H. gave the better of the race, but Gauchio was the victor.

Mrs. Harry Stover's St. Philippina beat Titus, the even-money favorite in the last race. The ride broke up a dozen starts, and in two splendid starts St. Philippina ran half mile before Kent could stop her. In spite of this, Mrs. Stover's mare stepped the five furlongs in 1:00½. The summary:
