Judge McBride Concurs.

ASTORIA, Or., Sept. 22 .- Circuit Judge McBride declared this evening in conver sation with a representative of the Asso-ciated Press that a defect in the direct primary law would not interfere with municipal elections to be held throughout the state this Fall. Judge McBride said:

"Right of suffrage cannot be taken from voters legally entitled to the privilege. Where the machinery of a new law will not apply to elections the machinery of the old law will apply. In other words, until the new law can become effective in a practicable manner, the old law hold good. Nominations may be made as they were under the old law, by conventions, and candidates elected will hold office regularly. I believe voters could again register this Fall, notwithstanding they had registered in the Spring, and that registry would be legal.
