CAN VOTE AS THEY WISH

EMPLOYEES OF WALLA WALLA PRISON ARE NOT INTIMIDATED. Superintendent F. M. Dryden Denies That He Has Attempted to Line Up Guards for Turner.

"It is true that I shall vote for George Turner for Governor, but the published statements to the effect that I am attempting to coerce the employees of the Washington State Penitentiary to support Turner are entirely untrue."

"I think I am as good a Republican as any of them, but I don't feel bound by the recent state convention and shall not support Mr. Turner. The fact that such statements are being made is a reflection on the employees of the penitentiary for Turner by threats of discharge. I don't know what has been done at the prison in the past, but the statements that I am attempting to influence my subordinates are false. This man Goodrich, who, I understand, makes the charges, did not quit the prison because he was commanded to do so by Turner, as he claims. His work was not satisfactory. He came to me a short time ago and asked for leave of absence until after election. I told him he could have it, but he wanted to know if he could come back and resume work after the election, and I told him I thought he had better stay on the farm."
