

### IS READY TO MARRY HIM

She is apparently devoted to the child and earnestly desires to marry her. He talked with the girl's brother as long as the nurses would allow the conversation to go on, and when the young man left Pierrier shook with him and begged him to tell Mary he would be all right within a short time and would be sure the next time to arrive at the rendezvous on the appointed day and not the day before.

Pierrier is still very weak and very sick, but he was happy yesterday. Mary Robinson's brother was at St. Vincent's Hospital yesterday morning to talk with him and he explained to the old man that the girl was willing to be a bride as soon as Pierrier was able to leave the hospital for the altar. Pierrier does not seem to care for the great differences in the ages of himself and his bride-to-be. He is apparently devoted to the child and earnestly desires to marry her. He talked with the girl's brother as long as the nurses would allow the conversation to go on, and when the young man left Pierrier shook with him and begged him to tell Mary he would be all right within a short time and would be sure the next time to arrive at the rendezvous on the appointed day and not the day before.
