Regarding the awarding of prizes for stock and dairy products, Mr. Scott stated that Oregon is lining up in excellent shape and that previous announcements regarding the dairy products of the state are by no means exaggerated.

The exploitation division of the Exposition is using every means to bring the Lewis and Clark exhibit to the attention of the people of Oregon and America.
