WASHINGTON'S VOICE IN 1900.

ROOSEVELT DEEPLY SENSIBLE OF HONOR DONE HIM

He Will Do All in His Power Not to Forfeit It, and Declares He Will Not Be a Candidate Again.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—President Roosevelt tonight, after the election returns clearly indicated the result, issued the following statement:

"I am deeply sensible of the honor done me by the American people in thus expressing their confidence in what I have done and have tried to do. I appreciate to the full the solemn responsibility this confidence imposes upon me, and I shall do all that in my power lies not to forfeit it. On the fourth of March, next, I shall have served three and one-half years, and this three and one-half years constitutes my first term.

"The wise custom which limits the President to two terms regards the substance and not the form, and under no circumstances will I be a candidate for or accept another nomination."
