## **COLORADO FOR HIM**

Roosevelt Carries the State by Over 10,000.

GOVERNORSHIP IS IN DOUBT

Peabody is Running Behind His Ticket, but Republicans Believe He is Safe-Scratched Ballots Will Decide It.

DENVER, Nov. 8.—Estimates at mid-night from scattering and incomplete re-turns indicate a plurality of over 10,000 for Rocsevelt in Colorado. The result as to Congressmen and state officers is in doubt, owing to the large number of ecratched ballots that have not been counted. In 120 precincts outside of Den-ver Peabody received 10,000 votes and Ad-ams 10,000, with 5158 scratched ballots un-counted. The scratched ballots in the en-tire state are estimated at over 40,000. been counted run in favor of Adama in the ratio of about two to one.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 8.—The Republicans made an almost clean sweep in Pennsylvania, carrying the state for Roosevelt by over 20,000, and electing two of the six State Senators and 29 of the 32 Congressmen. They have also elected about 175 of the 204 members of elected about 175 of the 204 members of the House of Representatives. This gives them control of both branches of the Legislature by a large majority, insur-ing the election of Governor Pennypack-er's appointee, P. C. Knox, for United States Senator to succeed the late M. S. Ousy.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 8.—The returns counted in ten wards in Philadelphia show a falling off in Parker's vote as compared with that of Bryan of 250, and an increase for Roosevelt over McKinley of 10.000. Republican leaders say the vote is far ahead of their wildest expectations, and say Philadelphia will show 160.000 plurality for Roosevelt, and the state will give a Republican plurality of at least 170.000.

INDIANA.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 8.—Indiama has been carried by the Republicans by from 6,000 to 55,000. The Legislature will be Republican Congressmen are elected by increased majorities, and the Republicans claim also the Second and Twelfth Districts, but they are in doubt.

The Republicans have almost, if not quite, doubled the McKinley plurality in the state of 36,65 four years ago. Vice-President-elect Fairbanks received the returns at his residence from private wires, which connected his home with the White House at Washington.

INDIANAPOLIS. Nov. 8.—At 10 o'clock Senator Beverldge, who has been watching the returns closely, said Rooseveit's plurality in Indiana would not be less than \$6.00 and probably more, and that the Republican majority on joint ballot in the Legislature would be \$6.

Chairman Goodrich, of the Republican State Committee, claims the state for Rooseveit by a plurality of \$6.00. The indications were that Hanly, for Governor, will run behind the National ticket about \$600 votes.

Roosevelt is Heartily Indorsed and Republicans Feel Sure of Governor. SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. L Scattered returns from this state indicate that

Rooseveit will have a piurality exceeding 7000. His vote shows a heavy increase in every precinct reported.

Indications point to the election of John C. Cutier, Republican for Governor, by a considerably smaller majority. In some districts, especially in Salt Lake County, two-thirds of the tickets were scratched, and the result may not be known before tomorrow afternoon. The American (anti-church) party vote in this county may reach 8000.

Twelve election districts in the city and state give Roosevelt 1818; Parker 1185. These are straight ballots only.

Weber County, in which Ogden is situated, will give Roosevelt 1600 plurality.

The Republicans have probably carried the First and Eighth Congressional Districts, hitherto Democratic.
