

OVER 40,000 VOTES

Roosevelt Wins a Great Victory in Oregon.

PARKER VOTES ARE SCARCE

Prohibition Carries in Benton, Coos, Curry and Gilliam—Other Counties Are Still in Doubt.

Douglas, Gilliam, Grant, Jackson, Lane, Lincoln, Multnomah, Sherman, Tillamook, Umatilla, Union, Wasco, Washington, Yamhill—24.

Prohibition prohibition only—Clatsop, one precinct; Walla-walla, one precinct; Wheeler, five precincts—3.

No election—Baker, Crook, Harney, Josephine, Klamath, Lake, Polk—7.

Elections were held in compliance with precinct petitions as follows: Columbia, one precinct; Grant, three precincts; Jackson, two precincts; Lane, nine precincts; Linn, one precinct; Malheur, ten precincts; Marion, five precincts; Wasco, five precincts; Washington, two precincts; Multnomah, 15 precincts; Lincoln, one precinct.

Marion County. SALEM, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—The most sanguine hopes of Republicans were surpassed in the election today when it is apparent that Roosevelt carried Marion County by 3000 plurality.

Estimates a week ago were that Marion County would go 1400 Republican. When Chairman Frank C. Baker listed this chair at 1800 for Roosevelt, many laughed at him, and 1800 was considered a safe estimate.

The vote of the county will probably exceed 6000, the fair weather and the interest in the prohibition question serving to bring out the voters.

In the 20 precincts heard from the vote on prohibition is 1700 for and 370 against, or a majority of 1330. This majority will probably be increased to 1000 or more.

Prohibition carried in a few precincts, among them Scott's mill, North Silverton, Aumerville, Chenewa and Liberty, but in all other precincts no action was taken, so the vote makes no change in the saloon matter in these precincts.

The anti-saloon leaders put out a doer this morning with a view to creating sentiment against the saloons, but if it had any effect at all it was the opposite of what was intended. All over the county the saloon proprietors made a special effort to get voters to the polls.

WOODBURN, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Complete returns from Woodburn precincts give an astounding majority for Roosevelt. Out of 388 votes cast, Roosevelt received 278, Parker 43, Swallow 41, Debs 27, Watson 5. Roosevelt has 221 votes over Parker and 165 majority over all candidates.

Prohibition results in an overwhelming defeat for temperance advocates. Anti-Prohibitionists carried Woodburn by 37 majority.

In 1904 McKinley carried Woodburn by only 15 votes. In 1900 by 47. The result has created intense excitement and enthusiasm throughout the city.

WOODBURN, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—From incomplete returns, Walter L. Toose, chairman of the First Congressional District, estimates Roosevelt's majority in the First District at 10,000 and 3,000 in the state. Marion County will roll up for Roosevelt the enormous plurality of 2500 or more.

Clackamas County. OREGON CITY, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Eighteen out of 27 precincts give Roosevelt 1700, Parker 448, Debs 261, Swallow 105, Watson 23. Roosevelt's majority, 1344. Complete returns will increase the majority of Roosevelt to 1200. Multnomah, the Democratic stronghold of the county, went for Roosevelt by a vote of 63 to 22.

Debs 154, Watson 4. The remaining precincts are strongly Republican, and will probably increase Roosevelt's plurality to 850.

In Astoria, Precinct No. 1, prohibition was carried by a vote of 14 to 12. The question was not voted upon in any other precinct. The vote cast is about two-thirds of the registration.

Wasco County. THE DALLER, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Fifteen out of 25 precincts in Wasco County show 1612 Rep., 414 Dem., 190 Soc., 218 scattering. For prohibition 868, against 128.

HOOD RIVER, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Three precincts out of five have lost the majority of 20 for prohibition in the Hood River subdivision. The three precincts on prohibition is: East, for 106, against 204; West, for 120, against 122; South, for 24, against 16.

EUGENE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—The Prohibitionists have lost the county by 100 to 300, but the full returns are not in.

Twenty-three out of 50 precincts give Roosevelt 2214, Parker 745, plurality against prohibition 1469.

ROOSEVELT'S majority here will be overwhelming and may reach nearly 2000.

EUGENE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Twenty-six precincts heard from give a majority of 407 against prohibition.

JUNCTION CITY, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Twenty-one out of 20 precincts give Roosevelt 2214, Parker 745, plurality against prohibition 1469.

BAKER CITY, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Complete returns from 11 precincts in this county out of a total of 344 which includes all precincts in this city give Roosevelt 1058, Parker 478.

DALLAS, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Complete returns from nine precincts out of the 20 in Polk County give Roosevelt 772 votes and Parker 284, a majority of 488.

DALLAS, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Twelve out of 20 precincts in Polk County give Roosevelt 888, Parker 237.

UMATILLA COUNTY. PENDLETON, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Prohibition received a hard blow in Umatilla County. It is conservatively estimated that the measure is defeated by 600 votes.

JACKSON COUNTY. ASHLAND, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Incomplete returns in Jackson County give Roosevelt 1195, Parker 401. Prohibition 581, against prohibition 192.

MEDFORD, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—It is believed that the two precincts composing Medford will go "wet," and that the county will be close.

WASHINGTON COUNTY. HILLSBORO, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Complete unofficial returns from 14 precincts out of a total of 21 give Roosevelt 1800, Parker 425 for Parker, making a plurality of 1400 for the Roosevelt electors.

COOS COUNTY. MARSHFIELD, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Roosevelt has carried Coos County by over 1300 plurality, double the highest estimate. Precincts with 50 votes went almost solid for him.

MARSHFIELD, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Coos County has gone all but unanimous for Roosevelt. His plurality will be not less than 1600.

ASTORIA, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Full returns from the city and from 81 of the 25 outside precincts in Clatsop County give Roosevelt 952, Parker 260, Swallow

Prohibition is defeated in the county by a small margin. Twenty-six precincts out of 50 give Roosevelt 1700, Parker 1086. The same precincts give 1700 votes for Prohibition and 1916 against. Incomplete returns on lesser candidates give Debs 203, Swallow 202, Watson 74.

Yamhill County. MCMINNVILLE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Election day passed quietly. The county goes Republican by about 1000 majority.

ALBANY, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Linn County has given the largest Republican majority in its history, the landslide for Roosevelt giving him a plurality of 1100.

CROOK COUNTY. PRINEVILLE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Out of a total of 423 votes, the Republican ticket has 308, Democrat 123, Socialist 23, Prohibitionist 6 and People's party 3.

MORROW COUNTY. HEPPNER, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Incomplete returns from the principal precincts in this county indicate a plurality for Roosevelt of 500, possibly more.

TILLAMOOK COUNTY. FIFTEEN precincts give Roosevelt 664, Parker 120, for prohibition 220, against 261. Tillamook City went dry in both precincts.

WALLOWA COUNTY. ENTERPRISE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Reports from Wallowa County tonight state that Roosevelt will win by a good majority, and that prohibition will be defeated, being voted on in only one precinct.

HARNEY COUNTY. BURNS, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—The returns from 14 precincts give the Republican ticket 124 majority. Roosevelt will carry Harney County by about 250. No vote was taken on prohibition.

COLUMBIA COUNTY. ST HELENS, Or., Nov. 2.—With nine precincts heard from complete and four to come, Roosevelt has 914 plurality. His plurality in Columbia County will be over 1000. Prohibition is defeated in every precinct.

LANE COUNTY. EUGENE, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Seventeen out of 20 precincts in Lane County give unofficial count Roosevelt 177, Parker 428, Swallow 68, Debs 78. For prohibition 779, against 864.

JOSEPHINE COUNTY. GRANT'S PASS, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Grant's Pass—Republican 432, Democrat 101, Prohibition 21, Socialist 160. No local option vote. The county not in.

LAKE COUNTY. LAKEVIEW, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Four precincts heard from, Roosevelt 121 plurality. It is estimated he will get 25 majority in the county. No local option vote.

LINCOLN COUNTY. TOLEDO, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Toledo gives Roosevelt 115, Parker 14, Debs 47. The majority against prohibition is 18. No other precincts have reported at 10:30.

BENTON COUNTY. CORVALLIS, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Benton County complete gives Roosevelt 1107, Parker 428, Debs 64, Swallow 122; prohibition 801, against prohibition 685.

WOODBURN, Or., Nov. 2.—(Special)—Woodburn is proud of the fact that Henry Altnow, 98 years old, cast his vote today for Theodore Roosevelt.

MONTANA. VOTES for Roosevelt and Elects Democratic State Ticket.

BUTTE, Mont., Nov. 2.—Montana is going overwhelmingly for Roosevelt. Later returns indicate a gain in the Republican vote of about 10 per cent over three years ago.
