

GRANT NOT GUILTY
Jury Returns Verdict After Five Hours' Deliberation.

DEFENSE SPRUNG SURPRISES
Shown by Bill of Sale That Grant Had Disposed of Gambling Paraphernalia Over a Month Before His Arrest.

In the case of Peter Grant, charged with running a gambling-house on July 21 last, the jury, sworn to try the case, returned a verdict of not guilty in Judge Cleveland's Court yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, after deliberations lasting five hours.

The defense sprung a surprise in the nature of a bill of sale, executed by Grant and Nate Solomon, of the roulette wheel and other gambling instruments of the Portland Club on June 24, nearly a month before the arrest, to Edwin Richardson, Raleigh Trimble and George Williams testified that they were witnesses to the execution of the bill.

After the evidence was all in the attorneys for the defense sprung a second surprise. District Attorney Manning made the opening argument for the prosecution, and it was supported by Hon. E. McGinn, who appeared as a special prosecutor to assist Mr. Manning, would make a sensational speech to close the case, following those of the lawyers.

Immediately after the close of the Grant trial, the case of the State of Oregon against Nathan Solomon, jointly indicted with Grant, was begun. Only eight jurors were chosen when court adjourned for the day, as follows: Delos D. Neer, T. W. E. London, Thomas Fox, John J. Lee, H. C. Nicolai, J. M. Barrett, J. E. Fox, W. G. McCormick.
