Williams, attorney, testified t E. B. Williams, attorney, testified that he had drawn up the papers. The con-sideration for the sale was \$1500. Attor-ncy Ed Mendenhall made the point, in introducing this evidence, that there was nothing to show Grant had regained pos-session of the property after the date of
