For Extension of Alaska Cable.

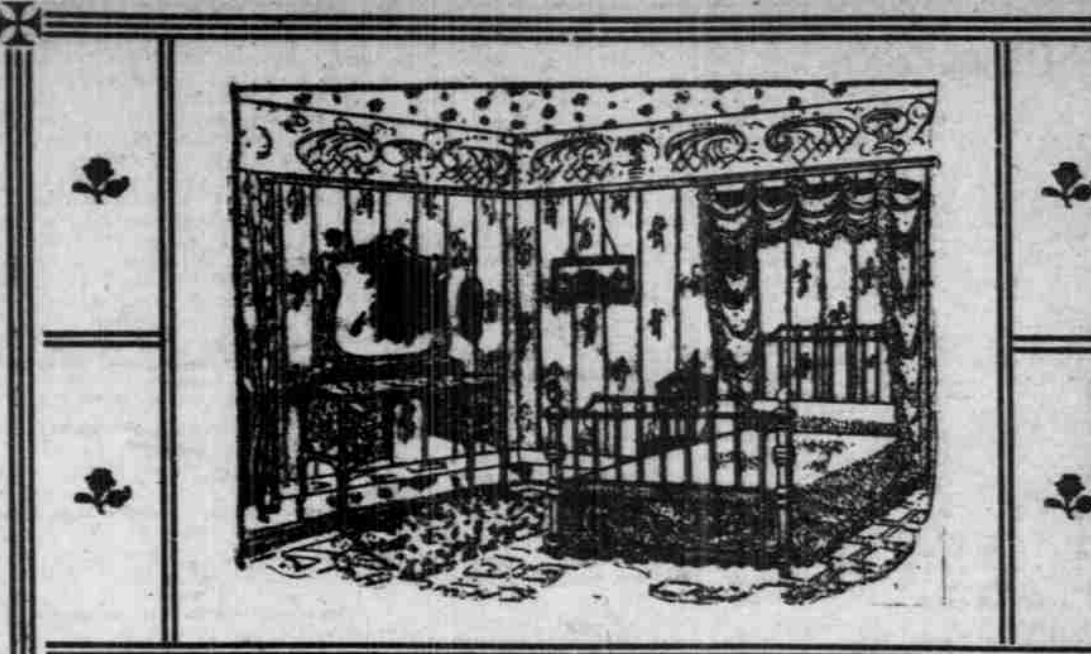
