

The third disturbance within the past week made its appearance this morning off the Washington coast, and it is now central over the Straits of Pucs, and moving rapidly easterly. Storm southeast warnings were ordered at all seaports at 7 A. M. and changed to southwest at 5.50 P. M.

A maximum wind velocity of 76 miles from the southeast occurred during the afternoon at North Bead, Wash, and the wires are down to Tatocosh Island, so the velocity of the wind at their station is not known.

The rainfall has been heavy along the immediate coast, but only light amounts are reported at interior stations.

The river at Portland has risen 4.4 feet during the last 45 hours, and it will continue to rise for the next few days.
