Increase in Paper Currency. NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—After a lively discussion, the Chamber of Deputies has passed the bill recently introduced regarding the redemption of paper money until January, 1910, cables the Herald's Valparaiso, Chile, correspondent. The measure will increase by \$200,000,000 the paper currency, which shall be issued in monthly installments. It also provides for the creation of a special fund and guarantees the total conversion of paper into gold when the limit expires. The measure has not yet been acted upon in the Senate.
