Increase the Paper Currency. NEW YORK, Dec. 5.-After a lively discussion, the Chamber of Deputies has passed the bill recently introduced proroguing the redemption of paper money until January, 1910, cables the Herald's Valparaiso, Chile, correspondent. The bill increases by 20,000,000 peace the paper currency, which shall be issued in month-ly installments. It also provides for the creation of a special fund and guarantees the total conversion of paper into gold when the time limit expires. The measure has not yet been acted upon in the Senate.
