We were not cursed illerature of the day, we were not cursed with blies of rank, perilicious, yellow-covered novels. We girls read novels-yes, and plenty of them But what were they? Balwer's, Walter Scott's, Dickens', Thackeray's, etc.-books sparkling with the brightest thoughts. In my circle there was not a girl of 15 who had not seen the best plays, and none who had not seen the best plays, and none who could not converse intelligently upon the great novels, and the great poets, such as Walter Scott, Byron, Burns, Milton and others. We even went so far as Toung's "Night Thoughts."
