We are being constantly confronted by new problems; the tariff, free silver and other big issues have been relegated to the background. Party principles are frequently ignored; party lines are often obliterated, and party leaders of the old school are being superseded by courteous clerks and pro-ficient stenographers.

Many of us who formerly read Shakes. peare, or Thackeray, or Lowell, or Dick-ens, or Harte, now read the pink sheets exclusively. Some of us who formerly assumed porterhouse steaks are living on broakfast foods. Many of us who used to enjoy a good game of baseball or football are now content to pay for the privilege of seeing others play, or to read about them in the sporting extras.

to get into the tide? Is it going into the business of training aspirants for public favor along lines which must appeal shortly to the taste as well as the judgment of an intelligent and discriminating public? In other words, are we to have a tureen party, a ladle machine, and is it possible that the American people will soon be called upon to cast their ballots for the man who knows all about purse or the man who has taken his doctor's degree in the consomme?

Instead of arousing partisan prejudice and wild public enthusiasm bereafter by appealing to the baser passions, it would seem that we are approaching the time when our political campaigns are to be managed from soup kitchens. While the contests will be lacking, perhaps, in some of the features which have made former political struggles landmarks in our Na-tional history, yet no doubt the politicians of the bean, split pea, tomato, extall, noodle, chicken, mutton, beef and cream of potato variety will be less inclined to disturb the business interests of the country than their forefathers, who gave us a country at the outset.

The Passing of the American Forest. W. Frank McClure in the December Booklovers Magazine.

Despite the rapid passing of the American forest, lumbering still stands in fourth place among the industries of the United States, Nearly 309,000 men are employed in lumbering occupations, and more than \$100,000,000 are annually divided among them in wages. Although the forbe restored, the demand for timber is in-creasing. The result seems inevitable, and presents a problem as far-reaching as the

area of the United States itself.

The picturesque logging regions of the northern woods, which once produced nearly one-half our entire supply, today hold in store but little of the valued pine which made them famous, and the cedar is also rapidly falling before the sawyers. The cypress trees of the Southland, once despised by the builders, are from necessity going into nearly every portion of the construction of handsome homes. The famous logging scenes of Maine will soon live in history only, while all eyes turn to the Pucific Slope for a Nation's supply. This gone, all is gone as far as the United States is concerned, except as the efforts of our National and state governments along the lines of scientific forestry succeed in coping with the situation.

The National forest reserves now aggregate more than \$0.00,000 acres, all of which have been provided for within the past 13 years. Most of these reserves are west of the Rocky Mountains. The Bu-reau of Forestry has been making large strides of late in the direction of better management of timber lands and likewise in the actual growing of trees. In Nebraska last year the work of planting 2,000,000 seedlings in the sandhills of the Dismal River district was inaugurated, State Legislatures are considering the exemption of timber lands from taxation. Schools of forestry are growing in number. Arbor Day, with its lesson, is ob-served in 44 states and is a legal holiday
