TURKEY SUPPLY SMALL

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 22.—(Special)—The supply of dressed turkeys today is much smaller than expected. Only 61 tons arrived today. Prices rose sharply. The good demand. Choice sold up to 25c, and extra brought 20c and 25c in a small way. Ordinary sold at 20c to 25c. Telegrams from interior points indicate that the supply, as farmers shipped in most of their turkeys at Thanksgiving time. Much depends upon tomorrow's receipts. Most of the buyers have been holding back, and light arrivals would cause a boom.

The grain market was dull and of a holiday character, but prices for leading cereals are holding fairly firm. No business has been reported in grain freights since the charter of the Max at a low rate. Additional vessels are engaged to leave port in ballast. The list of vessels now in port is as follows: 14,000 tons; 22,000 tons; on way, 10,000 tons. Rumors are still circulating that heavy Oriental orders for hay are being placed, but no definite confirmation is obtainable.

Apples are cleaning up well at stiff prices, the receipts having greatly diminished. Receipts of oranges are increasing, and the market is easy.

Potatoes are firm for the best grades. Onions are weaker, with large offerings. Early asparagus is selling at 10c to 15c. Broccoli, cauliflower and other vegetables are generally firm. DEAL IN MONTANA WOOL. Most important transaction in the Boston market. HOSIERY—Woolen, 22c; (Special)—A 500,000-pound lot of Montana wool, running well to staple, was the most important transaction in territory wools on the Boston market this week. The price is said to have been 25c. Considerable acreage territory has been sold, the moving at 60c and fine medium at 62c. Several additional important contracts in the West are reported closed. Careful estimates are that in the territorial sections alone fully 30,000,000 pounds have been contracted to date, a good portion of it in the triangle, including parts of Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Montana, Idaho, 5 per cent of the clip has been contracted. In Oregon, about 1,500,000 pounds, it is believed here, has been sold for Eastern delivery.

MORNING COUNTY WOOL CONTRACTS. ENTERPRISE, Or., Dec. 22.—(Special)—R. C. Mays, who is buying wool in this county for the S. Kohlman Company, of San Francisco, this week closed the contracts for over 500,000 pounds more of wool. This makes about three-fourths of the total wool clip of this county, including 1,000,000 pounds that were purchased in 1933. The total clip is said to be 2,000,000 pounds. With the wool clip and the prospect of a substantial rise in the price of good times are expected by the people of this county next year.

SATISFACTORY TO THE IRON TRADE. NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—The expected advance of \$2 a ton in bar plates and shapes which has just been made, is generally satisfactory to the trade, says the Iron Age. It was preceded by the booking of considerable tonnage. The billet association decided to let the official price alone, but the action had little significance.
