THE FATE OF A HUNTSMAN. Trespass Warrant Issued for Charles Burckhardt.

Charles A. Burckhardt is wanted in Columbia County to answer to a charge of shooting game on some other person's preserve. Sheriff Word is in possession of a warrant issued at St. Helens, by Justice of the Peace Watkins, which recites that Burckhardt entered upon inclosed prem-lees with intent to kill wild fowl. The warrant is indorsed "good for service on Sunday or any other day," and is dated December 6, 1864. It was delivered to Sheriff Word for service only recently, and the fact that the Columbia County Constable held it for over three weeks indicates that he expected that Charile would come down some Sunday for an-other shoot, when he could arrest him in Columbia County. As he did not come he has been sent for. The offense is only a misdemennor.

The name as it is written in the war-rant is Charles Burkhart. Sheriff Word, nowever, has been instructed to arrest Charles A. Burckhardt, ex-deputy post-master, as the person desired.
