STOCK MARKET OPENS WITH BRISK ADVANCES.

Closing is Dull and Weak-Increasing Ease of Money-News of Day Favorable.

NEW YORK. Jan. 8.—The second week of the New Year in the stock market atarted off with some animation, and brisk advances were scored pretty generally. But the start proved a false one, like that of the first week of the year, and interest had aimost completely died out by the afternoon. It was apparent that the movement represented very largely a trial of apeculiative sentiment in professional operations. Last week the halt and the reaction in the market were attributed, in a considerable degree, to the influence of the threat of legislation to regulate corporations. The influence of the professional traders that the sellers of lists week on this account would mare buyers on the new situation was general, but proved to be III-founded.

The bank statement of Saturday was little regarded, in view of the increasing case of the money market. Loans for 60 days could be had below 3 per cent today, and for six mooths the rate fell to 3k per cent, with growing complaisance on the part of lenders regarding collateral. The operations for future extensive gold imports this week were also deprived of much of their effect by this condition of the local money market. With discounts advancing in Loudon and the prespect of some further large loan issues in that market, the movement of capital to that center from here with money at the present unremuniversalive rates is not to be wondered at. The routine news of the day continued favorable to values. Bailroad traffic officials again reported the freight maximum limited only by the capacity of the railroads to carry what was offered, while heavy car shortages and to congest what cannot be premptly carried.
