Grand Jury Listens to Numerous Witnesses.

INDICTMENTS SOON EXPECTED

Geogre Sorensen Case Comes Up Today...Mr. Heney Will Try to Return to San Francisco as Soon as Possible.

The work of the Federal grand jury is still progressing, but slowly. It is not probable that any indictments will be returned before next week owing to the length of the testimony now being introcertain that when the start is made there will be a bunch of accusations brought in which will even up the apparent inactivity of the men during the two weeks

From the witnesses who are being called It is a hard matter even to guess at what is being considered in the little room, for they come from all sections of the state and from different walks of life. Those who live in Malbeur County are ushered ento the presence of the jury after some one from Roseburg, and the next wit-ness will perhaps be from Central Ore-gon. All this leads to the belief that the Government is sundwiching one case with another in order to save time in the long run, though such a course will not be productive of indictments with the grapidity that might be noted had one line of evidence been followed through from the beginning to the end. By the middle of the coming week it is conceded that a large num her of indictments will be returned, and at is hinted that the next return will practically close the work of the jury

It is known that Mr. Heney wishes to urn to San Prancisco at as early a date possible. He has interests there which suffering by reason of his absence. His clients are becoming impatient, it is maid, at the delay being imposed upon important matters pending in the Califor-nia courts, and many requests are being made upon the District Attorney to re-turn to his private practice, for a short

The fact that not a single indictment has been returned since the holidays lends solor to the theory that the jury will close its work with the next batch of indictments taken into court. This is borne out by the fact that it was expected that ne return would be made in a few days at the latest after the re-convention of the jury. It is, therefore, the supposition that the Indictments of several persons may have been voted upon but not as yet made public by reporting to the court it can almost be stated with certainty that in several instances sufficient testi-mony has been offered to justify indict-ment. The fact that many witnesses have been summoned from different parts of the state, who have been examined and discharged, leads to the belief that indict-ments have been voted and pigeonholed until the entire list is ready to announce at the completion of the jury's labors.
