CRISIS IS STAVED OFF. Castro Agrees to Terms of Settlement Named by Minister Bowen.

Correspondence of Associated Press.

CARACAS, Jan. 2.—It is said on undoubted authority that President Castro contemplated hastening what he felt to be a crisis with the United States by giving Minister Bowen his passports, but was deterred by a report that the Minister would not accept them.

It was in this acute situation that most of Castro's closest advisers induced him to make overtures to Mr. Bowen, who acknowledged them by suggesting that Castro might be able to settle his differences with the foreign powers by propos-ing to submit all disputed claims to arbi-tration; to make a permanent arbitration treaty; to pay the fixed sum of 5,000,000 lvars yearly, instead of the uncertain Solvers yearly, instead of the uncertain 30 per cent of the customs revenues, which collected this year only about 2,000,000 belivars, and to continue, after paying off the alleged peace powers, the fixed sum to the German and British bondholders. Castro accepted these ideas, except that

Castro accepted these ideas, except that he would not consent to arbitrate any but American disputed claims, unless the American Government urged him to do so. The proposed settlement is regarded here as of great importance in assuring peace and preventing possible complications which might involve the Monroe Doctrine.


