Joint Committee Finds Nothing Irregular.


TO MAKE FAVORABLE REPORT

Affairs of Institution for Care of Un fortunate Boys and Girls Said to Be in Good Condition Throughout

The joint committee of the Legisla-ture, consisting of C. W. Nottingham, of Multnomah, and Representatives T. B. Kay, of Marion, and B. S. Hermann, of Coos, which committee was to make investigation into the management of the Boys' and Girls' Aid Society, as conducted by W. T. Gardner, has met with the Board of Directors consisting of Mayor Williams, Dr. T. L. Eliot, L. L. Hawkins, F. E. Beach and Mrs. White.

At the last session of the Legislature an appropriation of \$4000 was made for the benefit of the society, and this year the society is asking for aid from the state to the amount of \$8000.

This circumstance, which makes the state a party to the control of the institution, is responsible for the investiga-tion just made by the committee. Charges have been made against the management


