

TO PEACE TALK

Rumors Strengthen Foreign Financial Markets.

SLIGHT EFFECT IN NEW YORK

Industrials and Specialties Still Command the Most Attention—Average of Prices is Constantly Rising—Exports of Gold.

NEW YORK, Feb. 7.—There were more railroad stocks included in the movement than there were yesterday, but the relative prominence of the industrials and specialties was still great.

The strength abroad was attributed to rumors of peace negotiations which were of less influence here, so that the higher prices for American stocks sent from London, while they were well retained, were not extended in the case of some of the leaders.
