

TEST PRIMARY LAW

Suit Brought to Determine Its Extent

IT MAY APPLY TO PORTLAND

Circuit Court Asked to Decide if It Has Any Bearing Upon the Municipal Election in June.

Suit to determine if an election shall be held under the direct primary law in April, and if it applies to the city election in June, was filed in the State Circuit Court yesterday afternoon by City Attorney McNary.

The court is asked to decide if it is legal for the County Clerk to open registration books and register voters and permit those already registered to appear and have their party affiliation added.

What is Averred. The further record is made that by the terms of the direct primary election law it is provided that the nomination of candidates for municipal offices by political parties shall be made subject to the provisions of the law providing for the registration of voters for the city election in June, 1936, and to incur an expense of about \$300.

That pursuant to the provisions of the direct primary law the County Clerk is asked to purchase and register voters for the election to be held for city officers on the first Monday in June, 1936, and to incur an expense of about \$300.
