# APPROACH OF LENT

Penitential Season 'Will Soon Begin.

TIME FOR FASTING IS NEAR

Archbishop Christie Announces the Regulations Which Are Binding Upon the Adherents of the Roman Catholic Church.

Lent will soon be here-Wednesday, March 8, when a large proportion of the Christian world will keep the penitential season. Archishop Christle, of the Ro-man Catholic Church, yesterday issued these Lenten regulations for his arch-diocese, which will be read Sunday in all the Catholic churches:

Lent begins March 8, All the faithful not legitimately dispensed are obliged in con-science to observe the laws of the church concerning the Lenten fast.

1. The use of fiesh mest is allowed at every meal Sundays, as well as the principal meal Mondays. Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, Saturdays of the Ember Days and

Holy Week excepted. 2. The use of fish, milk, butter and eggs

permitted on all days of Lent at the sening collation, and the principal meals on some days on which the use of fiesh most 3. In the morning a small piece of bread

is allowed with a cup of coffee, tea, chocolate or some similar drink.

4. When the principal meal cannot be taken before noon, the order may be inverted and the collation taken in the morning and the dinner in the evening. Lard or grease may be used in prepar-

ing the lawrel victural.

8. Those of the faith who are exempt from the obligation of fasting can, on the days when the use of flesh meat is permitted to all of the faithful, be allowed to an It several times a day, as on the Sundays of Lent, when the obligation is not bluding. The use of both firsh meat and fish together at the same meal is strictly for-hidden during the whole of Lent.

The following persons are exempt from The following persons are accupit from fasting: All those who have not attained their list year or who have passed their 80th year; those whose weak health or condition otherwise may demand the full amount of nourishment, and all those whose epations are of a laborious and ex-

hausting nature.

Those who are excused from fasting, on account of age or hard labor, may use flesh meat more than once on the days on which it is allowed.

It is eminently in accordance with the apirit of the church that all those who use the dispensations from the fast and absti-neurs, should supply, in part, the spirit of penance, by prayers and almsdeeds; by voiding all public shows, parties and amu nts, and by abstaining from all intoxicating

The time for making the Baster com-munion extends from Ash Wednesday to Trin-ity Sunday, inclusive. All the faithful are eby warned that all those who neglect to make the Easter communion violate a law of the church which binds under pain of mortal sin. The transgressors of the law are, moreover, subject to excommunication, and, should they die, to privation of Chris-

Parents have to answer to God for their children. Let them, therefore, romember that they are obliged in conscience to see that their children and others under their

that their children and others under their charge receive Easter communion.

The reverend rectors are requested to have special Lenten devotion: Wednesdays and Fridays. The exercises shall consist of the beads, instruction and benediction on Wed-

beads, instruction and benediction on Wednesdays, and the way of the cross and benediction on Fridays.

During the month of March the authorized prayer of St. Joneph will be recited after the unmai prayers of the mass.

We also request the reverend clergy to read to the people, in the vernacular, the gospel for each day during Lent, and that this he done at the hely mass every morning.
