# WILD WITH RAGE

Denver Teamster Kills Neighbor's Family.

#### SETS FIRE TO THE HOUSE

Fires Fusillade From His Barricaded Home.

POLICE OFFICERS WOUNDED

Sheriff's Men Called In, and Steady Attack is Kept Up Until the Murderer is Brought Down by a Chance Bullet.

DENVER, March 11 .- Mad with rage because of his defeat in a lawauit, in which the man he pronounced as his bitterest enemy had been victorious, and awearing vengeance against himself and his entire family, George Schlatler, a teamster, armed himself with a rifle today, and when the smoke of battle had cleared away three persons were dead, one missing and three others lay wounded, two, at least, dan-gerously. The dead are:

K. FILL MRS. K. FILL GEORGE SCHISTLER.

The missing: A child of the Fills.

Wounded:

Dr. Frank Dulin, police surgeon, Captain William Bohanna, acting Chief of Police. Mike Kelly

The wife of George Schistler is prostrated over the affair and may die from

Schistler had brooded over his troubles with the Fill family, who were immediate neighbors, and announced tothat he would even up matters. Taking a rifle of improved pattern and buckling on a belt of smokeless cartridges, he started for the Pill home

Husband and Wife Shot Down.

Fill saw him approaching and heard his muffled threats. He tried to avoid him by entering the house, but Shistler sent a bullet into his brain with the accuracy of a marksman, and Fill fell dead, Mrs. Fill rushed to her husband's side and received a bullet from Schist-ler's rifle, fired with unerring aim. She, o, fell dead beside the lifeless body of her husband.

Not content with the fullness of his vengeance, Schistler then set fire to the Fill home, which was destroyed, and it is thought a son of the Fills lost his life in the fire. After satisfying himself that the flames would perform their mission, Schistler returned to his own home and barricaded himself in-

In the meantime other neighbor's attracted by the sound of the firing, appeared on the scene, but quickly retreated when bullets began falling around them. A telephone message was sent to Police Headquarters, and an ambulance with Police Surgeon Dulin. Captain Bohanna and three officers hur ried to the scene.

Officers Within Deadly Range. The officers were directed to the Fill

home by neighbors who had witnessed the killing, and they started unhesitatingly in the direction of the house. In doing so they were compelled to come within range of Schistler's rifle. A volley of bullets rained around them suddenly, and Dulin and Bohanna fell to the floor of the ambulance. The driver stopped his horses, but another shot from the house dropped one of the animals to the ground. With the assistance of spectators

the wounded men were taken from the ambulance and conveyed to a hospital, where their wounds were dressed. Dulin was shot three times, once in each leg and another time in the left thigh. His condition is critical. Bohanna received a builet in the leg, but is not dangerously hurt.

call for reinforcements brought all the available men from police headquarters and the Sheriff's office, and a consultation was held for the purpose formulating a plan to capture the madman. Firing squads were stationed in nearby houses, and a larger force was placed in a portable fort, made of baled hay piled upon a hay wagon.

ties Movable Hay Fort.

During the preliminary arrangements Schietler kept up a continuous fire in all directions, which was returned, and hundreds of shots were exchanged. It was during this shooting that Kelly received his wound. Finally fewer shots were heard to explode in the direction of the Schistler house, and the hay wagon fort was started toward the house, proceeding cautiously and without firing.

The attacking party expected a fusillade any moment, and when they reached the front gate without a shot being fired, one of the officers stepped out into view, thinking to draw the fire of Schistler, if he were still alive He was agreeably disappointed, and with a rush the officers charged the house and battered down the door.

Not a sound came from inside, and, entering, they found Schistler lying upon a bed, bleeding from several unds and breathing his last. He dted soon afterward. It is not known whather he was hit by bullets from the weapons of the pursuing party or com-

Wife May Die of Shock.

Mrs. Schistler was away from home hen her husband started on his vengeful mission, and when told of the affair fell prostrated. It is thought she will die from the shock.

During the several hours' battle with the murderer many people were atated in an outlying suburb, and Mayor spaer and Police Commissioner Hewitt precised the work of the police to a cer-
