That a man has a right to earn his anily bread, whether he belongs to a union or not, and that he has a right to defend himself when attacked, even by the use of a revolver, if necessary, is practically what a jury in the Municipal Court decided yesterday when Charles Bock was acquitted on a charge of carrying a concented wearon.

Patrol-man Porter arrested him and took from him a revolver. Porter therefore appeared as complaining witness, but behind the case stands the Longsboremen's Union, with which the Sallors' Union has been at outs over the Emigh's freight. It is claimed the longsboremen refuse to work on the vessel themselves, and that they do not want the sallors to do so. There was but the testimony of Pa-trolman Porter and Bock, but much time was consumed, as there were frequent

was consumed as there were frequent tilts between attorneys. Judge Hogue also took part occasionally, as at times he bit the attorneys were not con ing the case along strictly legal lines. Deputy District Attorney Hancy appeared for the state and Attorney Citron for the Citron maintained throughout defense. Citron maintained throughout the trial that the jury must either, by its decision, give a man the right to carn a livelihood and to defend himself when attacked or say he could not. Haney argued that it was purely a case of violation or monviolation of the law.

Beck did not deny having the revolver.

He admitted that he purchased it for the purpose of protecting his life, and said he carried it in a pocket inside his vest, which left the handle in sight. After arguments by counsel and instructions to the jury, it was but a few minutes when a verdict of acquittal was brought in.

Toby Smith was then placed on trial, charged with assaulting Paul Tram. The defendant is a member of the Longshoremen's Union and the complainant of the Saliors' Union. The trouble took place over the Emigh's cargo, as in the previous case.
