

HOLDING DOWN LID

Trepoff Tries to Suppress Cry for Liberty.

BOULIGAN PLANS CONGRESS

Russians Impatient for Call of National Assembly—Red Flag Waves Among Workmen—Rebels Denounce Bureaucrats.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 10.—The main attention at home is being given to the work of the Bouligan Commission, which is charged with formulating the plan for the representative assembly promised by the imperial rescript of March 2.

The summary closure of the lawless congress in St. Petersburg yesterday, in the midst of the opening session of what promised to be a repetition of the Moscow conference of doctors, manifests the firm hand with which Governor-General Trepoff is managing the difficult situation.

Revolutionaries yesterday contrived an impromptu meeting in front of the Putiloff Iron Works at the hour for beginning work.

Anti-Semitic proclamations have been issued at Smolensk and Orel and posted at fence corners in that section of Russia.

Widow Breaks Eccentric Will. OLYMPIA, Wash., April 10.—(Special.)—The Supreme Court has affirmed the lower court in declaring void the purported will of Hartley, an eccentric pioneer of Thurston County.

WASCO, Or., April 10.—(Special.)—The city election held today for the purpose of bonding the city to the amount of \$25,000 was carried, only three votes being cast against the proposal.

Methodists Would Out Smoot. NEWARK, N. J., April 10.—A resolution which called upon the United States Senate to unseat Senator Reed Smoot and which declared opposition to Mormonism was adopted unanimously by the Newark conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church today.

LIBERAL MEETING DISPERSED. Lawyers Declare for Freedom Before Police Break In.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 10.—The first Pan-Russian Congress of Attorneys took place today in the hall of the Imperial Economic Society.

Before the police actually interfered the congress adopted resolutions providing for the formation of an association to foster social and professional intercourse and to strive for the political freedom of Russia.

Strikers Resort to Murder. LODZ, April 10.—James Ratoloff, a British subject and manager of Posen-ski's cotton mill, was stabbed today while returning from mass celebration to commemorate the end of the strike.

Boys Blow Up Czar's Picture. ST. PETERSBURG, April 10.—During morning prayer today at the High School of Romny, government of Poltava, a portrait of Emperor Nicholas was destroyed by an explosive which was let off behind the picture.

Attempt to Murder Official. ST. PETERSBURG, April 10.—Nine shots were fired at the Governor of the prison at Libau last night as he was returning to his residence outside the town.

ROAD TO THUNDER MOUNTAIN. Idaho Turns Over Nearly Fifteen Thousand Dollars to Contractors.

BOISE, Idaho, April 10.—(Special.)—The state today settled with the Northwestern Bridge & Construction Company for the construction of the Thunder Mountain road, turning over \$13,661.

Grand Jury in Umatilla. PENDLETON, Or., April 10.—(Special.)—District Attorney G. W. Phelps today announced that the first four days' session of the Circuit Court would be devoted to the deliberations of the grand jury

which will be called to investigate the numerous alleged violations. This news was received by many Pendleton people as a surprise, as it has been many years since a grand jury session has been held here, and many alleged violations, such as gambling, keeping of bawdy houses, selling adulterated foods, Sunday opening of saloons and business houses, have not been regarded in the least.

Witnesses Languished in Jail. BAKER CITY, Or., April 10.—(Special.)—The County Court today dismissed the bills of the prosecuting witnesses in the whiskey cases for the time they were in jail, pending the disposition of the cases by the court.

Steel for Medford Road. MEDFORD, Or., April 10.—(Special.)—Mathias Reed, of the Medford & Crater Lake Railroad, returned today from Portland, where he had been on business in the interests of the road.

Fine Sawmill is Burned. FOREST GROVE, Or., April 10.—(Special.)—The largest and best-equipped sawmill in Washington County, owned by W. H. Lyda and located four miles north of Forest Grove, was totally destroyed by fire at an early hour this morning.

Escapes the Law by Suicide. MINNEAPOLIS, April 10.—Apprehended by detectives who had come to arrest him after being accused of alleged stolen goods, Mrs. W. J. Moore, said to be from Seattle, charged with being a thief, has committed suicide in her apartments by taking carbolic acid.

Halitones Two Inches in Diameter. PITTSBURGH, Pa., April 10.—One of the worst halitones in years passed over Pittsburgh this afternoon. Halitones two inches in diameter fell, doing much damage.

Spanish Wheat Crop Falls. WASHINGTON, April 10.—The State Department has received the following cablegram from American Consul Hirsch, at Malaga, Spain: "Wheat has been reduced 50 per cent on account of the crop."

Labor Riot in Madrid. MADRID, April 10.—A collision between workmen and police occurred today on the Calle San Bernardo.

MAY BE MURDERER

Thought to Have Escaped on Redondo.

LEFT STEAMER AT EUREKA

Thought to Be Torturici, Slayer of Man Whose Headless and Limbless Trunk Caused Such Sensation in San Francisco.

Pietro Torturici, the suspected murderer of Biagio Villardo in San Francisco last week, is supposed to have escaped by the Redondo and to have gone ashore at Eureka, Cal., on the voyage up, and made his escape without detection.

The Redondo was one of the first boats to clear from San Francisco after the murder, leaving at 3 o'clock in the morning of the second day. She carried 22 second-class passengers, among whom Torturici is suspected of having been.

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Torturici is telling more of her suspected husband's actions every day. Torturici either displayed considerable skill in covering up his manner of leaving the city or was assisted by the other members of a secret society.

Information from Eureka received today is to the effect that the man who reached that city on the steamer Inagua, and who was supposed to be Torturici, the alleged murderer, has succeeded in establishing his identity. He is declared not to be the person for whom the police are searching.

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DRIVEN INTO UNION

British Unionists See Dangers of Disunion.

WILL TRY TO COMPROMISE

Chamberlain Sees Necessity and May Abandon Some of His Tariff Theories—Open Split With Balfour the Alternative.

LONDON, April 10.—A new move is on foot, as the result of the Brighton rebuff (the defeat in a constituency that had been regarded as safely conservative) of the recently appointed Junior Lord of the Treasury to effect some closer union between the Balfourites and Chamberlainites sections of the Unionist party.

How reconciliation would be effected is a matter for conjecture, but the indications are that Mr. Chamberlain recognizes the necessity for abandoning the idea of taxing food and raw materials.

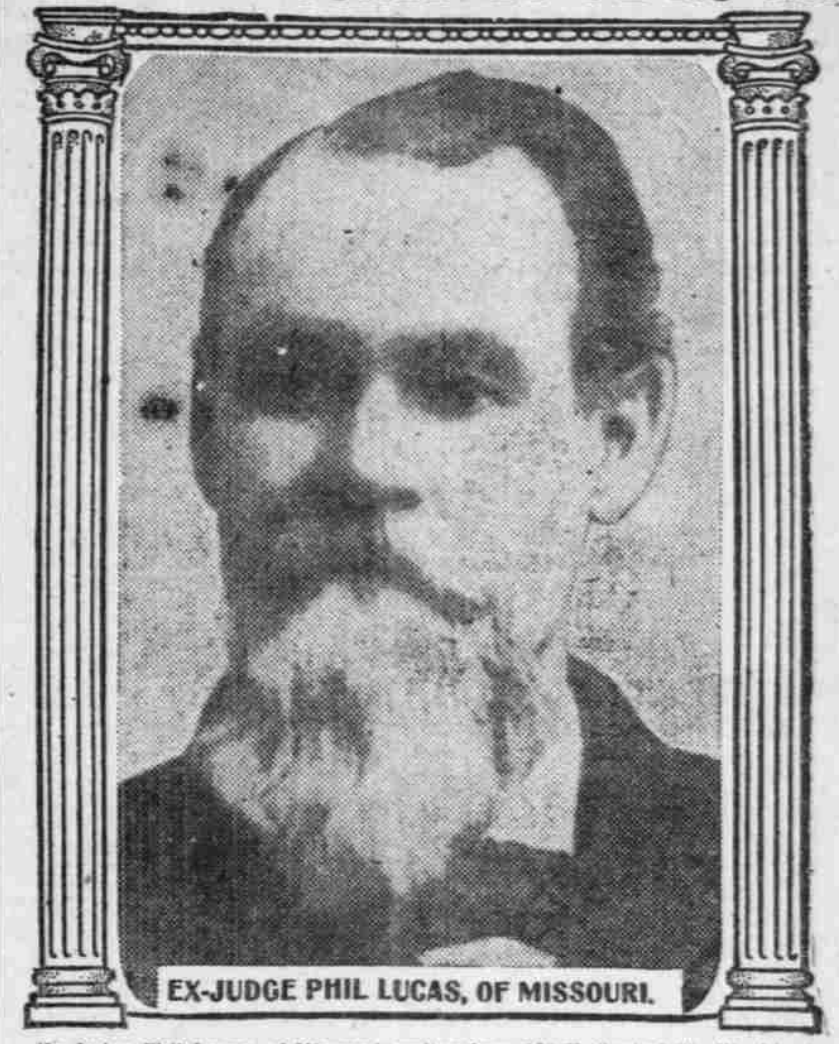

DEATH OF PIETRO TOZZO WOULD MAKE HIM A MURDERER

Pacific restlessly to and fro in a cell of the City Jail, is Jim Canello. He is nervous, and cringes when strangers enter, for he fears they may communicate to him news that he is a murderer.

Both men are Italians. The prisoner is aged 45, has lived in Portland three years, and speaks but little English. He was arrested in the Municipal Court yesterday on a charge of assault with intent to commit murder, and was given until today to plead.

When visited in his cell yesterday afternoon, the prisoner was very nervous. He did not wish to talk of the affair that has landed him in jail, and that may yet cause him to be branded as a murderer.

"No," "No," "No." "No understanding," said the prisoner, when asked concerning the shooting affair. "How did you come to shoot Tozzo?" was asked of the prisoner.

"I know nothing about it," he replied. "Yes, you drunk?" was asked. "Yes, I was drunk," he replied. "And you do not remember shooting Tozzo?"

"No." Beyond telling his age and occupation, the prisoner would not make any statements. He was glad when the artist finished the sketch, and seemed greatly relieved when returned to the inner cell by Jailor Branch.
