

CRAZED BY COCAINE

Dr. E. L. Irvine Terrorizes the Tenants of Building.

ARRESTED BY PATROLMEN

When the Police Came the Physician Threatened Them With Shotgun and Knife, but Was Finally Disarmed.

Not daunted by a double-barrel shotgun pointed full at their faces, Patrolmen Cole and Hoesley about 3 o'clock yesterday morning arrested Dr. E. L. Irvine, of 280 1/2 Grand avenue, who was temporarily deranged through the use of cocaine.

Dr. Irvine became insane Saturday night and threatened to kill the tenants of the building in which he was staying. He walked up and down the halls of the building, carrying the loaded shotgun and the large knife, defying anyone to molest him.

Patrolmen Cole and Hoesley were detailed to the case and when they arrived at the scene of action they found the crazed man in a room on the second floor. They tried to reason with him and finally had to submit to arrest.

The policemen did not rush at him as they realized it would have meant sudden death, but waited until he had turned his head as he thought he could obtain assistance by pushing the electric button.

Suddenly he reached down to his bosom and drew the knife, which he had exhibited a few hours before. He was about to sink it deep in the body of his nearest assailant when a heavy blow on the jaw caused him to drop the weapon and prevented him from becoming a murderer.

Dr. Irvine has been under the surveillance of the police before, as he is known to be a desperate man when under the influence of cocaine. Recently the attacks have been more frequent and each time he became more dangerous and desperate.
