

NEW FORTS IN MAKING

ESQUIMALT STRONGHOLD NOT ABANDONED BY BRITISH.

Absence of Navy in These Waters Given as Reason of Activity in Fortification.

SEATTLE, May 18.—According to statements made to the Post-Intelligencer by the staff photographer of a Chicago newspaper who gained admittance to the fort, Great Britain is not abandoning her fortifications at Esquimalt, as has been inferred from the dismantling of the old works, but, instead, is building stronger and more modern defenses.

"I saw the big 9.2-inch guns stored at the rear of the hill," he said, "and saw the engineers working on four batteries, upon which they are to be mounted. The Royal Engineers have charge of the construction of the new fortifications. I met Colonel English, senior officer in charge of the barracks at Esquimalt. He is not in command at the point where the work is going on, but informed me that a new fort was being built.

In answer to my question if the war in the Far East had anything to do with the construction of the new fortifications, he replied that he thought not. "We have to have on the Pacific Coast at the present time," he said, "but our government realizes that better protection to British waters in the northern end of Puget Sound is needed.

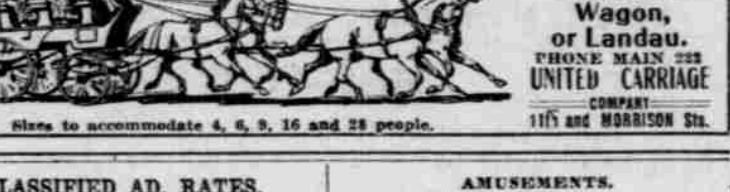
