Big Trust Company in New York Closed by State. IT MUST RAISE \$1,000,000

Overloaded With Undigested Securities, Merchants Trust Company Goes Into Receivers' Hands. Trolley Causes Trouble.

NEW YORK, May 23.—The Merchants Trust Company of this city, was closed today by the order of the State Superintendent of Banks, because it had made loans amounting to \$1,500,000, upon which it had not been able to realize sufficient money to pay depositors and save the capital of the company from impairment.

Stock was Once High. The company was organized in 1859. In May, 1903, the stock reached a high point, 250 being bid for it.
