Charles F. McGinty Candidate for That Punishment.

HELD TO THE GRAND JURY

He Knocks His Wife Down, Blackens Both of Her Eyes, and Admits His. Guilt to the Court.

Upon recommendation of Deputy District Attorney Haney, Municipal Judge Hogue yesterday held Charles F. McGinty to the grand jury on a charge of assault and battery, preferred by Mrs. McGinty, Because of the fact that the whipping-post act, passed by the last Legislature, is now

in effect in Oregon, the defendant is li-able to punishment of that nature. He pleaded guilty to the charge. "I think the defendant deserves more than ordinary punishment," said Mr. Haney to Judge Hogue, "He admits his guilt, and it is evident from the appearnce of that woman sitting there was terribly beaten. I think he should be held to the grand jury, so that more adequate punishment may be meted out, if

the courts see fit to inflict it."

McGinty waived examination, and was held under bonds of \$30.

He said he had no money with which to

engage counsel, and was not at all fam-illar with court proceedings. He was in-formed by Judge Hogue that he was entitled to a preliminary hearing. If he wished it, but that under the circumstances, he probably would be held to the grand jury anyway.

"It does't make much difference what you make my ball." said McGinty, "for I can't give any amount."

To the police Mrs. McGinty related a pathetic story. She said her husband at-tacked her Thursday evening, knocked her down and beat her. Both of her eyes were blackened, and she appeared weak nd exhausted. She claims that for a long time her husband has been endeavoring to persuade her to live an evil life, which se has persistently refused to do

Both are waiters in restaurants. There is a little daughter, who is at a private coarding-house. The cause of McGinty's wrath, It is said, was a desire of his wife The assault occurred in their apartments,

This is not the first time the McGinty's have been in trouble. About one year ago he and she were arrested, with another man, on serious charges. Detective Resing, at that time Humane Officer, took the trio into custody. In order to avoid trial and the danger of a term in the Penitentiary, the woman married Mc-
