Murderer Williams May Appeal to the Governor.

REHEARING IS DENIED HIM

Supreme Court Affirms the Judgment of Death for the Killing of Alma Nesbitt—Lawyer Eastham Had Cause.

Norman Williams has been denied a rehearing in the Supreme Court and will be sentenced to be hanged at the electric chair for the murder of Alma Nesbitt.

SALEM, Or., May 29.—(Special).—The Supreme Court today denied the petition for rehearing in the Norman Williams murder case.

The Supreme Court also dismissed the disbarment proceedings brought some time ago against H. C. Eastham, an attorney at Baker City.

These charges having been preferred, the Supreme Court had testimony taken regarding the same, and upon a review of that testimony the charges are dismissed.

The opinion says that: "While we are not to justify the course in legal ethics, it is but natural and human for a person to show some meanness when attacked in such an unmanly and unwarranted manner."

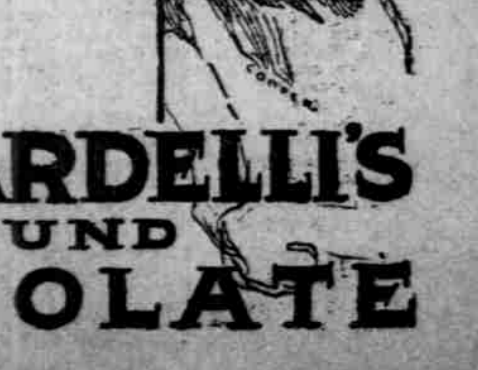
