Yield in Oregon Will Be About One-Third of the Average.

FRUIT IS OF LARGE SIZE

Petites Make a Better Showing Than Italians-Market Opening Earlier Than Usual-Offers of 2 1-2 Cents Basis Price.

SALEM, Or., June 8 - (Special) -- Manager H. S. Gile, of the Willamette Valley Prune Association, has just received reports from fruitgrowers in every section of the Willamette Valley, concerning the condition of From these reports, coming from the lead-Ing growers of their respective communities, Mr. Gille concludes that the yield of prunes this year will be about one-third of an average crop. In the Rosedale district South of Salem and in the hills around Dallas and Dundes the yield will vary all the way from a half to a full crop, but in many sections the reports show not more than one-fourth of a crop and in some instances a total follows:

Without any apparent reason, the year varies widely in each locality. One grower in a community will report a full crop, while his neighbors report a total failure or only a third to half a crop. The probability is that the difference is due chiefly to the topographical conditions which made the trees more or less subject to adverse weather conditions. It is severally asserted that the ditions. It is generally americal that the crop was injured by frust and it is likely that lowingd orchards or orchards on particular hillside exporures were at the proper stage of development it suffer injury when the frust occurred. This seems to be the most plausible explanation for the great difference in the condition of crops in the

difference in the condition of crops in the same locality.

Potte or French prunes seem to have fared best and many growers report nearly a full yield of this variety. By far the greater proportion of prune trees in the Valley are Italians, however, and there are few reports of a full crop of this variety. As a rule, the Italians have been found to be more

of a full crup of this variety. As a rule, the Italians have been found to be more reliable producers than Petites, but this seems to be an exceptional year. In this as in previous pears, the hill crchards seem to be doing much better than iswiand occhards.

The prume market is opening earlier than usual this pear, and sales are already being reported from the East. The Willametts Valley Prupe Association has had offers of a basis price of 2% cents for prunes which will include the 20-50 size. Present indications are that the Italian crop will go into the three larger sizes and average not less than 40 to 50 to the pound.
