Swedish Government Declares Pro-

visional Government Illegal.

STOCKHOLM. Sweden. June 12-For-eign Minister Gyldenstolpe has sent the following circular letter to all the Swed-ish-Norwegian Consuls:

After the Norwegian Storthing had established a provisional government for Norway and in connection therewith de-clared the union with Sweden dissolved the Swedish government decided not to recognize said provisional government. You are therefore instructed to continue the exercise of the functions constitution-ally devolving on you as Swedish as well as Norwegian Consula, with this restric-tion, that you must not enter into com-munication with the illegal Norwegian government or obey its orders. In all mergencies you must apply to the Min istry of Foreign Affairs for instructi

Injured by Premature Explosion.




