

CZAR MUST GIVE LIBERTY FIRST

Constitution Russia's Necessary Prelude to Treaty of Peace.

WHOLE NATION DEMANDS IT

Imperial Family No Longer Represents Nation and Liberals Say National Assembly Alone Can Raise Indemnity.

CHICAGO, Ill., June 14.—(Special.)—The correspondent of the Daily News at St. Petersburg cables as follows: Russia demands a constitution before peace. The provinces have joined St. Petersburg and Moscow in this demand. Nobles, merchants, farmers and several of the Generals at the front have severed their adherence to the Moscow petition. The leaders of the movement arrived here yesterday. The Czar intimated that he would receive only five of them. The delegates at today's meeting selected five of their number and instructed them to insist on the immediate promulgation of equal rights without distinction of nationality or creed, and on the convocation of a national assembly, which should decide on peace and draw up a constitution. Baron Gunzburg, who assisted at the meeting, said to your correspondent today: Czar No Longer Is Russia.

"The Czar wants peace and the people want a constitution. The one without the other is impossible. Japan demands an indemnity and guarantees. Only a nation can give these. Treppoff's undiminished bonds are not sufficient. A year ago the Tsarsko-Selo group represented Russia; now it represents only a family. Three months ago many nobles and capitalists, fearing change, gave in their adherence to the Tsarsko-Selo group. Since then the Baltic fleet battle and the fact that the navy officers are almost exclusively the relatives of great nobles have alienated them.

Bankers Refuse Money.
"Aphonsie Rothschild's death deprived the Tsarsko-Selo group of the only financier who believed in the regeneration of the autocracy. Now European, American and Japanese financiers and statesmen refuse to deal with the bureaucracy and demand the country's backing. The Treppoff regime and the schemes of Boulgair, Minister of the Interior, will prove ephemeral, and within a few months a constitutional government and a lasting peace will be established, either with the consent of the Tsarsko-Selo group or despite its opposition. This will bring unprecedented prosperity."

WITTE PROPHECIES TROUBLE
Takes Gloomy View of Russia's Future and Japan's Demands.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 14.—The Slova this morning published a remarkably sensational interview, filled with the gloomiest forebodings, with M. Witte, president of the committee of Ministers. The Russian statesman's name is not mentioned, but the veil of his identity can be pierced by the veriest tyro. He evidently speaks with the profound conviction that the affairs of state are going from bad to worse, and under persons at irritation produced by the intrigues which compel him to sit idle during the present crisis. Every word was black with pessimism.

The statesman made it clear that Foreign Minister Lamsdorff, for one, opposes his having anything to do with the peace negotiations. Asked concerning the report that he was going abroad, charged with a mission in regard to the negotiations for peace, M. Witte replied, his words being given literally, as they contain much hidden meaning: "No, I certainly will not go on such a mission, for three reasons. The last of them is that I shall do everything to avoid it. Even if the rumor of Lamsdorff's resignation is true, which I insist is not the case, the main situation would not be changed, and the first and third reasons would hold for me. Nothing that Russia has gone through is surprising. I gave warning in due time that only matchwood of Rojstevensky's squadron would reach Valdivia. In a word, I justly earned the designation of a croaking raven."

"I do not see that affairs have yet taken a turn which makes my services desirable. I will say more: even now, I cannot observe a definite desire to change the direction of the current. The bed of the onrushing stream remains the same. Only the obstacles in its path grow more numerous and forming rapidly, indicate the danger points."

"As for peace, Japan will be willing to discuss no basis which would not insure peace for at least 10 years. Her conditions doubtless have also considerably increased. She will, of course, agree to open negotiations on her own soil without mediators, with a person whom Russia will clothe with special powers. Herein lies the real source of the rumors circulating in the Berlin and London cabinets about my trip."

"Yes, there is truth in what you say, but you see a different estimate is put upon the rumors abroad. People there are better informed and appreciate more clearly the conditions prevailing in Russia than we do here."

"Russia could prolong the war for five years in the hope of coming out victorious were it not for the events in the interior to which they are closing their eyes and stopping their ears and trying to know nothing about."

"Here lies the horror of the present situation in Russia. Every hour of delay is fraught with danger. Down, down, lower and lower, step by step."

WOULD MAKE SPEECH TO CZAR
Disagreement Delays Zemstovists' Audience With Czar.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 14.—The audience of the delegates of the Moscow Zemstovists and Mayors with Emperor Nicholas has been postponed until Friday.
