In every street there are long rows of Cuban flags draped in mourning, and even the poorest tenement houses creep tied to the windows. The Spanish Club joined in the mourning by hoisting the Castilian flag at half-mast.

ELECTRIC PLANT IN ASHES

Snohomish Company Suffers Third Loss in Thirty Months.

TACOMA, June 18.—A special to the Ledger from Snohomish, Wash., says: The body of John Paul Jones, the first Admiral of the American Navy, to this country, started on its voyage to France today. The squadron, consisting of the flagship Brooklyn and the cruisers Chattanooga, Tacoma and Galveston, arrived at the anchorage off Tompkinsville two weeks ago, and remained there pending the arrangements by the French authorities of the ceremonies incident to the embarkation of the body of the Admiral at the port of Cherbourg.

BOYCOTT AMERICAN GOODS
