City Officers Before Municipal Judge Hogue

"I will hold the defendant to the grand jury, in order that he may have a chance to get a taste of the whipping-post."

F. D. McDonald heard Judge Hogue make that statement yesterday morning, and turned pale. Victims of the lash and knout, a jailer with a strong arm and authority to thrash wifebeaters, loomed up before him. He grew nervous, and trembled, even at the prospect.

He is keeper of a notorious saloon at Twenty-sixth and Upsher streets, at the roof garden, where frequent brawls and fist fights have recently occurred. He said his wife, who signed the charge against him, was entirely to blame for the trouble.

"She refused to go out of the saloon, and I took hold of her ear and led her out," McDonald told Judge Hogue.

"I was afraid to go with him, for I saw his eyes in an expression that told me he would beat me if he got me home," explained the wife, who was holding a babe in her arms while an older child played about her feet.

Judge Hogue then inquired if McDonald had ever beaten her, to which she replied that less than three weeks ago he beat her, after smothering her with cold water. She said he knocked her down and beat her frightfully.

Then it was that Judge Hogue held the defendant to answer in the Circuit Court.

When David Kennedy appeared before Judge Hogue last night, he was very much surprised to learn that on the previous evening he had run amuck on East Burnside street, causing a panic among the natives there. That he had kicked out the window lights in the Star Brewery was still more news to him.

"I don't remember a thing about it," said Kennedy.

"Well, I think that a man who gets so crazy drunk as to do what you did, is dangerous," commented Judge Hogue.

"Whether you recall it after it is over is not material. The fact remains that you menaced life and limb and destroyed some property, besides frightening people nearly to death, sentence you to the city jail for 30 days in the city jail."

GAS CAUSES DEATH

Tragedy Results in Loss of Two Lives.

Death by gas asphyxiation in their sleeping apartments at 256 Eleventh street was the fate of Mrs. R. F. Myers and Mrs. William Jones. The tragedy occurred some time between 3 o'clock Tuesday night and 5 o'clock yesterday morning. The women evidently left one of the gas jets of their room partly open. Both bodies were shipped to Jefferson, Or., last night, where burial will occur. Both were from that place.

SAD DETAILS OF AFFAIR

One Woman Makes Desperate Fight for Her Life and Expires at Threshold Too Weak to Open the Door.

Death by gas asphyxiation in their sleeping apartments at 256 Eleventh street was the fate of Mrs. R. F. Myers and Mrs. William Jones. The tragedy occurred some time between 3 o'clock Tuesday night and 5 o'clock yesterday morning. The women evidently left one of the gas jets of their room partly open. Both bodies were shipped to Jefferson, Or., last night, where burial will occur. Both were from that place.

That Mrs. Myers put up a fight for life seems evident from the fact that she was found dead at the threshold of the door, and because much of the furniture in the room was strewn about, as if the woman had made a desperate effort to get out.

Mrs. Jones died in bed, without a struggle. Coroner Finley, who was summoned upon the discovery of the sad affair, believes that Mrs. Myers became aware that her life and the life of her companion

was in danger, and that she arose and attempted to save herself and Mrs. Jones; that she was confused and in a stupor and did not have sufficient strength to call for help or to open the window or door.

R. F. Myers, with Fred and Datus Myers, the sons, slept in a room above. Before retiring for the night, the dangers of gas were discussed by the party, and Mr. Myers warned his wife to be sure and turn out the gas very carefully. At 4 o'clock yesterday morning he went to the room and detected the odor. He called the landlord, and when the door was opened the tragedy was revealed.

Coroner Removes Bodies.

The bodies were removed to the Finley undertaking establishment, and were held until the arrival of Mr. Jones from Jefferson. With Mr. Myers and the sons, he departed last night with the remains.

The party reached Portland Tuesday morning from Jefferson. They were en route to Prineville, where they expected to settle upon timber claims. They anticipated a trip to the Lewis and Clark Exposition grounds, after which they proposed leaving for their destination.

Mrs. Myers was aged 33 years, and Mrs. Jones 27. Mrs. Jones is a farmer, and large interests in and around Jefferson, and Mr. Jones is a barber.

SAD FUNERAL OF JOE RIGGS

Friends of Heart-Broken Parents Attend Services.

The little white hearse stood in front of the Grace Methodist Church yesterday afternoon, and the heavy fragrance of flowers came through the open vestibule of the edifice. Inside the sorrowing friends of Dr. and Mrs. J. O. Riggs gathered to pay a last tribute to little Joe, their 7-year-old son, whose life went out last Monday as the result of a horrible accident. The funeral services were unusually impressive and tears streamed down the faces of strong men and women at the inconceivable grief of the stricken parents. Loving hands had placed many beautiful nosegays about the casket and the words spoken by the pastor, Rev. Clarence Trus Wilson, were full of pathos and sympathy. The pallbearers, George Frideaux, W. Patterson, Walter Brown and Norman Lewiston, bore the casket down the aisle, while friends stood and attempted to soothe the childless mother, who followed it on its last journey. The interment was made at Greenwood in the family vault.

Marries Four Couples in One Day.

Varmon and Miss Alice Venson, North Dakotas, were united by Dr. Wilson, who at 2 o'clock was at 206 Twenty-fourth street, where he united Charles Ramo Cameron, of this city, to Miss Nancy Pauline Adair, of Omaha, Neb. After spending a pleasant hour with this happy couple in their new home, Dr. Wilson returned to his home to find M. P. Davis and Miss Alice E. Evans, with a jolly automobile party, awaiting the pastor's return, and they were wedded at 3 P. M. the fourth couple the pastor had married on the evening of the 23rd, and the sixth in two days.
