Murder and Suicide in Mountains of Washington.

WEST VIRGINIA BAD MEN

First Quarrel to Occur in Colony of Mountaineers Had No Known Basis Except in a Drunken

CHEHALIS, Wash., July 2 - (Special.)-The first serious trouble that has occurred among the West Virginia mountaineers and the potlach was given in his memory. who live in Eastern Lewis County was a murder and suicide today, near Riffe Postoffice, 42 miles east of Chehalfs. 
