

SECOND TRIAL WILL DIFFER

Methods Adopted by Heney in His Effort to Secure a Conviction.

NEW WITNESSES IN CASE

How Prosecution Will Seek to Prove Perjury Was Committed at the Instance of Williamson, Gesner and Biggs.

J. N. Williamson, Dr. Van Gesner and Marion R. Briggs will listen this morning to the testimony introduced by the Government in its second effort to convict them of subornation of perjury. The first witness will be placed upon the stand by Mr. Heney and the real commencement of the re-hearing will be made.

The second trial will differ from the first in some ways, so it is expected from the nature of the case. Like two generalists who have before measured their strength one against the other, Mr. Heney and Judge Bennett each will take advantage of the trial that has passed and will anticipate the moves of the other in so far as is possible.

It was intimated by Mr. Heney in his statement to Judge De Haven at the close of Saturday's session that he would change the theory of his case. In the prior hearing it was presumed by the Government that perjury could be proved according to the indictment, at the time of filing upon the claims by the various applicants, but this presumption has, upon the investigation of the District Attorney, been overturned, and in the second trial now in progress the Government will attempt to show perjury of the applicants upon their proof. It may be that this will change the conduct of the case in material things, and it perhaps will throw a cloud over the procedure of Mr. Heney in the trial, as there has been intended by him. It is not thought, therefore, that the trial will be handled in exactly the same order by the Government as was the case in the hearing just finished.

New Witnesses to Be Called.

New witnesses will be brought upon the stand, so it is expected, though nothing more than the opening statement of Mr. Heney to the jury can be brought as foundation for the supposition. It is understood that the Government will produce witnesses who will swear to having seen Mr. Williamson in Prineville between the dates of June 15 and 24, that being the period of which the defendant has no remembrance. It is thought that Charles Graves, ex-County Surveyor of Crook County, will be a Government witness, though he was brought here at the first trial and not used. Others who made timber filings than those who appeared as witnesses will be placed upon the stand. It is thought, some of whom will tell of having entered into a contract with Gesner, to the best of their understanding, for the delivery of their claims to the sheep firm upon patent being issued. It is the opinion of those who listened to the opening argument of Mr. Heney on Saturday morning that the Government will make an attempt at this time to connect Mr. Williamson still more closely with the case than was attempted at the first trial. No bit of evidence of any kind or directed to any one of the three defendants has come into the possession of the Government will be overlooked in the presentation of the prosecution's case.

Plan of Defense.

The defense on its part has strengthened its position in many ways, so it is said, and will make a still more desperate fight than in the first instance. The knowledge of what the Government has in the way of evidence will be of benefit in handling the case and every advantage that can be gained from this knowledge will be grasped by the attorney for the defendants. One thing that the defense will attempt to show in the controversy with the Government is that all of the claims filed upon with money furnished by Gesner and Williamson were covered with good timber, that they were more valuable for the timber than for the land, and were taken on that account in large part. This evidence will be used against the Government which has attempted to show that the claims taken were good for grazing lands principally, and, therefore, much to be desired by the defendants as additions to their range. It is expected that the new matter introduced at the trial will overcome the time saved by the previous settlement of technical points by the rulings of the court, and that as a consequence the second trial will be fully as long as the first. It is not thought that the case will be submitted to the jury much before the end of the coming week, and perhaps not then with arguments of any length are indulged in by the attorneys.
